Our programs are running smoothly. Helen Davidson, our intern from PeachTree City UMC continued her journey to Mozambique before her return to the US by the end of July. Having her here with us has left a very positive impact among all of us - especially our students and orphans. Helen and some of our students helped orphans to write letters to their sponsor parents. She is already missed by all. We thank God for what He is building in the heart of this young teenager for missions!



We would like to inform all our friends that we have lost Papa Bruce after his long fight with cancer. Papa Bruce was a powerful supporter and donor of KM for years. He donated a 100/66 meters piece of land to KM in the village of Aneho hoping that a training center and school for boys, or a Guest-House could be built there. That land is located in a very nice

area and it faces the Atlantic Ocean. Unfortunately, we have been unable to build anything there, or make any improvements to the land, because of a lack of funds. Most of our Togo Mission Teams have been taken to see that piece of land and, many have visited and had dinner with Mr. Bruce - especially the June 2006 Team. We continue to pray that God will open doors for that beautiful piece of land to be expoited.



We have continued working hard with our Interns from WATS, Nigeria, our students and staff in our Outreach program. Especially important is the visitation of elderly people providing them with practical and financial help and very much needed spiritual support. The hands on ministry is our principal goal when visiting these needy people of God – many have been abandoned by their families. We clean their yards and houses, wash their clothes, cook a meal for each one of them, bring more clothes and pray with them. Every one of the elderly person visited is left in a very good and positive spirit.



It is the rainy season here. Everyone is working soil planting crops to feed themselves. KM is also planting corn, beans, cassava, yam and other crops to help feed our orphans, elderly persons, our students, staff and workers.
